McLoud is located in northwestern Pottawatomie County, 25 miles east of Oklahoma City and 12 west of Shawnee. It is served by Interstate 40, US Highways 177 and 62 and State Highways 270 and 102. Situated south of the North Canadian River, the terrain surrounding the community is a mixture of trees, open fields and pastures.

McLoud was founded on June 21, 1895 and named after railroad attorney John W. McLoud. It was originally located north of its present location and was serviced by Rock Island Railroad. Settlers were forced to relocate the town to the higher ground on the southside of the river due to a flood around 1900.

At different times McLoud has thrived on the cotton industry, been declared as the "Blackberry Capital of the World" by President Truman, and is presently the location of the headquarters for the Kickapoo Tribe of Oklahoma.

We are proud of what McLoud has to offer for its community. The McLoud Blackberry Festival is the longest running food related festival in the state of Oklahoma and it is hosted by the McLoud Chamber of Commerce in July of each year. Wes Watkins Reservoir is a treasured spot to camp, fish, boat and swim on a hot summer day. The McLoud Veterans Memorial Park is growing and has beautiful views of ponds and trees that can easily be enjoyed from the Lawrence Wahpepah Walking Trails throughout the southern expansion. The McLoud Public School district is known for its incredible staff's commitment to excellence and currently has a student body of approximately 1,700.

Centered geographically in both the state of Oklahoma and in our Nation, McLoud will continue to entice people. It lies in the hub of a huge economic wheel of developing growth. State and interstate highways, the new Kickapoo Turnpike, railroads and the Will Rogers World Airport are all only minutes away - all of which involve a large work force. North Deer Creek Recreation Area is a 1,142 acre reservoir operated and maintained by the City of McLoud. The reservoir offers a variety of recreational activities for everyone to enjoy including boating, fishing, camping, and swimming.

<u>REGULATIONS</u>: In order to ensure that all lake patrons have the most enjoyable experience possible, we ask that you abide by our simple regulations. Here are a few for you to review. For a complete list of regulations, please contact our Lake Ranger, Lake Manager, or McLoud City Hall.

- * No alcohol
- * No glass containers of any kind
- * No parking in paved areas
- * Swimming is at your own risk and only in designated areas
- * Only campers and their visitors are allowed in the designated camping areas
- * Quiet areas will be in place and enforced from 10pm to 7am
- * Camper checkout time is 2pm
- * All pets are required to be leashed or in hand when in public areas
- * Please keep all permits in your immediate possession
- *No tent camping in RV area
- * 2 week stay limit on tents and 30 day on RV
- * refer to the City of McLoud for golf cart/ATV regulations/permits
